Humility

Over this past week, I was trying to look for way to grow myself spiritually, but I didn't know how to do that. As I was thinking about it, I was sitting in class at Oklahoma Christian and my professor, Kent Hartman started to talk about the importance of evangelism. Then it got me thinking about how to start a Bible study in my home. I knew that I probably needed to start in the gospels, so I decided to start reading Luke.

When I started reading Luke, I realized that there are many things that I missed when going back and reading. One particular thing I missed was in Luke 7:1-10, which is the story of the Centurion Servant.

As an athlete, I was always told that in order to be successful, you had to be able to contribute in some way to your team. To us, that meant you had to almost prove your worth. And I think that in life, we definitely have to prove our worth in many areas. Whether that is in school, your job, or in any competition, you had to show people in some way that you are valuable and

good enough to earn that paycheck, earn that trophy, earn that grade, etc. In Luke 7, the Centurion proved that he was worthy enough to have his servant healed, according to the Jewish elders in verse 4 and 5. He was a Roman leader, he loves the nation of Israel, and he helped build the synagogue in Capernaum. But Jesus tells him that he has great faith not because of his worth, but because of his humility in verse 7. The leader believed that a carpenter who was from Galilee, had the power to heal his servant. We aren't worthy of the things that God has blessed us with, but God gave us the gift of grace anyway, because he loves us. And He gave us a blueprint on how to live. In order to receive it, we have to first understand humility, that we are under a God who is higher than the government, higher than parents, and higher than the wealthy. If we understand humility and do the things God tells us because of our love for Him, he gives us access to something better than anything on Earth than we could dream of, and that's Heaven.
