"No Figs"

Matthew 21:19 ¹⁹ Seeing a lone fig tree by the road, He came to it and found nothing on it except leaves only; and He said to it, "No longer shall there ever be any fruit from you." And at once the fig tree withered.

Jesus was hungry, and He went to the fig tree for nourishment, but it was empty of figs. It is an interesting story in scripture as He pronounced judgment on the tree and it withered, Jesus used this as an example of faith to His apostles. He told them if they had faith, they could do the same thing, even more, they could move mountains.

However, I always wondered if there wasn't a larger illustration in this story. The fig tree had a function to produce figs, but it failed to do this. The Apostles, with Jesus, had a function to do the will of Christ on this earth. Just as the fig tree failed in its function, so could the Apostles fail in their function. If they did, would they escape the same judgment rendered to the fig tree?

This was at the end of Jesus' ministry. He knew they would soon be on their own, they would need faith and motivation to accomplish their mission. Failure was not an option, and they needed to understand the power of Jesus, not only to give life, but to take life.

You and I have a function in the kingdom also. Not just to have faith but to be obedient to the faith. If we just exist, and fail to do in this life what Jesus requires of us, are we any different than the fig tree? We are to produce fruit!! To spread the word, to encourage each other in the way of life, and to show love to our fellow man. The fig tree was destroyed because it failed in its mission, how can we expect to escape if we fail in our mission?
