"The Weight of Guilt"

The conscience is a weird part of our mind. Some call it the little voice you hear inside your head when you think you are doing something wrong. It, sometimes, is the feeling you get in your gut when you think you may get caught doing something you shouldn't, or somewhere you should not be. However, it can also be the voice that reminds you of your past guilt. The battle, as Paul would state, is waged in our mind between who we wish to be and who we are, or maybe, more accurately, who we were.

Can we truly leave our past behind? Many Christians would state that we should, we have died to what we were, we have a new life in Christ. However, we are a product of our past, it, inherently, makes us who we are. Paul states that we die to sin and are raised to walk in newness of life, but Paul also never forgot his journey before his conversion.

It is wonderful to be forgiven, I am so glad that Christ has forgiven me of the sin in my life. I totally understand that forgiveness, that God will remember my sin no more. It is easier for me to accept forgiveness than it is for me to

forgive myself. There are episodes in my life that the guilt I feel can never by erased in my mind. I carry a weight of guilt that I am unable to forgive myself for. This does not mean that I consider myself unforgiven by God.

So, how do we make peace with our past? I don't know that I have all the answers to that question, but I do have a few. First, if it is possible, make amends with what burdens you by asking forgiveness, making retribution, or finding a way to pay the debt that you feel. Second, accept forgiveness if it is offered, many times the things that weigh us down have truly been forgiven, we just refuse to accept it and forgive ourselves. Thirdly, remind yourself that you are not perfect, and that is okay, remind yourself that you did the best you could at the time with the information that you had. Hindsight is really 20/20, we must forgive ourselves for sometimes not knowing the consequences of actions and decisions that we make. If we could see the future. we would, I'm sure, change today, but we have to do the best we can with the information that we have.
